

New School Year Update

Dear Parents / Carers

I hope you and your families are well and have had a lovely summer. I just want to provide an update regarding the new school year starting next week.

Changes for 2025-26

As of September the school will be increasing in size, growing from ninety to ninety-six places; eighty places will be for pupils who have been, or are at risk of Permanent Exclusion, the other sixteen places are for pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), primarily for Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs.

The new, expanded staff team will allow us to further improve and develop our offer to the pupils in our care every day; the team will be able to provide even more bespoke learning to suit the diverse needs of the pupils in the Academy. Ove the coming weeks, new staff, and existing staff in new roles, will make contact with you to introduce themselves and explain how they will be supporting pupils in their roles.

Finally, we have invested significant funds into further developing and improving the buildings, completed works include:

Main Site

- New main doors and external entrance rendering.
- Renovated the front office and Reception area.
- Built a new pupil entrance, off the main hall this will be the only point of access for pupils in the new school year.
- Renovated the Computing room.
- Installed four new rooms for targeted support sessions for pupils.
- Bespoke 'Working Boards' installed in targeted spaces.
- Refit of the Meeting room and previous Nurture room, to create two totally separate spaces, the Nurture room will be further developed once pupils return.
- Created a new room for Therapy / Counselling sessions.
- Installed Air Conditioning in the two upstairs classrooms.
- Installed a new large window in our AtS provision, as well as modifying desks pupils work at in AtS.





Key Stage 2

- Installed a new room for targeted support sessions for pupils, meaning there will be two bespoke spaces for such work from September.
- Installed a bench in the Reflection area for safer use of physical control / restraints.
- Bespoke branded blinds installed in classrooms, Contravision panels installed on windows to limit vision into classrooms from outside.
- Bespoke 'Working Boards' installed in targeted spaces.

Start of the new school year

School will re-open to staff on Monday 1st September for an INSET Day, Tuesday 2nd September will also be an INSET Day.

- All pupils will be expected back in school on Wednesday 3rd September;
 - o KS3 & KS4 pupils should be in school by 09:00
 - o KS2 pupils should be in school by 09:10

Uniform

We fully intend on starting the year with all pupils in full, correct school uniform, this includes all Key Stage 2 pupils; below are the details of the school uniform.

If pupils arrive at school and are not in correct uniform, they will be directed to return home to change, and sanctions will be applied on their return to school; staff will liaise with the Assistant Headteachers / Deputy Headteacher when this is required.

Lockers / Personal Belongings

In the new school year, we will continue to have lockers available for all pupils, pupils should only bring essential items into school. All pupils will be provided with all the equipment they need by teachers and our BfL Mentors. When entering the school building pupils will be expected to hand in all personal possessions to staff; this includes coats, bags, mobile phones, vapes etc. These possessions will then be securely locked away in pupil lockers for the remainder of the school day.





When there are concerns about what pupils may be bringing into school, we will conduct 'bag checks' to ensure that no illicit items are being brought into the academy. At the end of the school day pupils will have their possessions returned; those pupils who have detentions / sanction time after school will receive their possessions only when the sanction is completed.

From September, pupils at the main site will now enter through a new entrance which has been built at the side of the building - off the main hall. On arrival to school, pupils should use the intercom by the side gate, the Admin. team will then release the gate so pupils can access the new entrance. Staff will then greet pupils in the new entrance, conducting the usual checks and taking person items to be locked away in lockers.

Transport

Locations and timings of our minibus in the mornings and afternoons have been revised for the new school year, to reflect the changes in where pupils are based; a detailed breakdown is below. Please do read the schedule carefully, the minibus will not wait for pupils, we do expect them to be on time at each pick-up / drop-off point.

As with last year, there will be just one minibus run in the afternoon, there are only fifteen seats available and the pupils with the highest 'Net' points score for the day will be given priority. Please remind pupils that vaping, smoking etc. is not allowed, any pupils caught doing so will be banned from the bus.



Lunches

Due to increased costs of ingredients, energy and staffing, we have been instructed by the Trust to increase our lunch prices for the new school year; from September, lunches will now be £2.75 per day, £13.75 per week.

On a more positive note, we have recruited a new cook for the kitchen – Mrs Smorthit is a very experienced cook and over the coming weeks and months she will be significantly expanding the menu available to pupils, we will be asking pupils for suggestions for meals.

Safeguarding at the Academy

Safeguarding is everybody's business and part of our role in the Academy is to ensure we keep pupils, staff and volunteers safe.

Safeguarding is the overriding priority at the Academy and includes aspects such as first aid provision, medical care plans, attendance, anti-bullying, risk assessments within the Academy and for educational visits, the safe recruitment of staff and volunteers etc., along with the more obvious areas of Child Protection, Child Sexual Exploitation and Prevent.

There are six members of staff who are Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) in the Academy. Their role is to support other professionals in the Academy to recognise the needs of children, including protecting from possible abuse or neglect.
