As we settle into the term, we would like to take this opportunity to remind all pupils, parents and carers of the high expectations we uphold at our academy. These expectations are in place to ensure that every child can thrive in a safe, respectful, and ambitious learning environment.

We ask for your continued support in reinforcing the importance of:

- Attendance and punctuality, where your child is expected to attend and be on time every day.
- Excellent behaviour both in and out of the classroom.
- Respecting others and contributing positively to our school community.

We fully expect all of our pupils to wear the correct uniform, with pride. This is non-negotiable and comprises of:

- Plain black trousers or black knee length skirt
- A white polo shirt
- A plain black jumper, with no logos, hoods will not be allowed
- Plain black footwear, suitable for a busy school environment.

When entering the academy building, all pupils should hand their outdoor clothing and any other equipment to staff, who will store this securely until the end of the day.



Pupils who arrive in incorrect uniform or do not hand over their possessions, will not be allowed into the building and parents will be expected to attend the academy to take the personal possessions, or collect pupils and bring them back to school in the correct uniform.
